


COME RIDE WITH US




I look forward to seeing each of you on a ride soon.

Safety

Check Your Helmet

Love them or hate them, in California we all have to wear them. Helmets are more than just a piece of safety equipment, they are an expression of your personal style. Whether you like a half helmet, a 3/4 helmet, a full face or a modular where the chin bar will lift up, what you decide goes on your head is a personal decision. I've worn several different helmet styles



along my journey and I was completely happy with each decision. Although looking back at some photos from 20 years ago I have to say that the mushroom head half helmet look was not the best. I know many Harley riders think they have to wear black everything because...well, because they ride Harleys. But I know some that swear by their white helmet because it stays cooler in the summer. I have a friend that wears a day glow yellow helmet because he hopes those other people we share the road with might see him a split second sooner. But, at some point, it's time for a new helmet.

Here are some signs to look for when inspecting your helmet.

Fit – Make sure your helmet is not loose or too worn.

Damage - Check for visible scratches, dents, or other damage.

Impact – Your helmet is only designed for one critical impact event.

Age – Your helmet is designed to last 3-5 years.

If your helmet is not quite up to the job then this is a great time to get a new one. Biggs Harley-Davidson is running a promotion for the entire month of April for 20% off when you trade in your old helmet. My good friend Taz would also want me to remind you of your Rider Rewards program where as a Biggs HOG member you will get double points when you purchase your new helmet. And if you do it on the day of the Chapter Meeting you will get 3x points. I'll let Taz do the math for you on those points, but it's a big bonus.



As you look for a new helmet there are a few items to keep in mind.

Certification – new helmets in the US are required to meet DOT standards but DOT is the minimum. There are separate agencies the conduct additional testing and award their own certification. Here are the current certification standards that you may see:

DOT FMVSS-218 SNELL M2020 ECE 22.05 FIM

Fit – Your helmet needs to be snug and should fit in a way that it will not come off your head in a crash. If you're not sure, check with the associates in clothing for a proper fitting.

Finally, keep in mind, you get what you pay for. A quality helmet is a well-constructed piece of safety equipment that is designed to protect your brain from injury. Expect to pay a price for quality. I would advise against buying a used helmet from eBay or other resources like that. You have no idea of the history of that helmet.



Throttle Control

Group riding is much like a team effort. Everybody in the group needs to be on the same page, riders as well as passengers. This is why we hold Formation 101 every month and the Pre-Ride Brief before every ride.



What is not talked about much is *throttle control*, striving to maintain a constant speed, especially if your route is on an interstate or highway. This increases safety, keeps all riders together, and improves fuel efficiency.

It's understandable that newer riders may not have the same experience with throttle control as riders who are more seasoned. Throttle control is something that is practiced and practiced. And yes, not everyone may be as good as you may be at taking curves. But backing off and creating a gap so you can go faster around a curve just messes with everyone behind you.



Try to be consistent. It's a lot easier to ride with people who are predictable and not "Rubber Banding". Hold your line, be smooth and steady with your speed, and pay attention to your surroundings.

And that, my compadres, is my advice for the month.

Ride 365 Program

Hello fellow Biggs HOG Members. It's hard to believe that it's April already. There have been quite a few Great Rides already and plenty more to come. I look forward to seeing you on a ride soon. So, as you ride, get credit for the miles you ride and earn cash rewards in the process. How? You may ask?



Last month, we went over many of the benefits of being a HOG Member. This month, I'd like to go over the *Ride 365 Program*. The *Ride 365 Program* runs from January 1 to December 31 of each year. Although this is a National HOG Program, each Chapter contributes to the mileage ridden by its members reporting their mileage. This is done by stopping by the Service Department and having one of the Service Representatives read and input your mileage into the *Ride 365 Program* database.

All Biggs HOG Members have been assigned to the Biggs Chapter in the National HOG Database. All miles ridden count towards the Biggs HOG final mileage total at the end of the year. All Chapters are ranked, in each region, based on the reported mileage. Here's the catch: Each Biggs HOG Member must go and have their mileage read at the Service Department at the beginning of the year, and at least at the end of the year, but occasionally throughout the year, if desired. Again, only Service Department Personnel can enter your mileage.

As you accrue mileage, you will receive mileage milestone patches and pins to add to your Chapter Vest. Provided you are enrolled, these come automatically once each milestone is achieved and the mileage is reported in the *Ride 365* Database. You can have your mileage entered as often as you like.



Mileage Milestones include:

1,000	25,000
** 2,500	40,000
5,000	60,000
7,500	80,000
** 10,000	100,000
15,000	150,000



** Here's the Bonus: You will receive a \$50.00 Gift Card after you ride 2,500 miles and a \$100 Gift Card after you ride 10,000 for the year. Entering your miles often will get you your cash awards sooner.

So being a HOG Member definitely has its perks. It's up to you to take advantage of those perks. Log onto HOG.com, enroll into the *Ride 365 Program*, and get credit and cash for the miles you ride!!

One for the Books

"It's one for the books" is a phrase we use when an event is completed successfully. Having recently returned from the first LD/ON Trip for 2023 to Yuma, I can say that it was completely successful. There are photos and tales about the trip elsewhere in this newsletter.



As Historian, one of my jobs is to occasionally write about what happened in our Chapter 5, 7, 10 or more years ago. So, sit yourself down in my WABAC Machine and let's visit early 2013.

Biggs HOG ended 2012 with 922 members and by the end of the first quarter 2013 had 542 new/renewed members. The Chapter crossed the 1,100-member mark before the end of that year. Amazing.

We were always a Chapter that rides. A LOT. In 2013, the Chapter scheduled 4 Long Distance (LD) Rides and 2 over-nighters (ON). The first ON for the year was to Laughlin, NV in February. Other LD and ON trips planned were to Joshua Tree, Bryce/Zion, a California Coastal Tour, Carson City, and Apache Junction. While we may repeat these destinations over the years, the LD committee always manages to find new things to see and do if we return. Every LD or ON trip becomes "one for the books".

Memorable local rides during the first quarter of 2013 included the annual NY Day ride to Richies in Murrieta, helping with the Carlsbad Marathon, rides to Dana Point, Peterson Auto Museum in LA, the San Diego Police Museum, the California Science Center to view the Space Shuttle Endeavor, and the Leatherneck Museum.

In March 2013, there were 2 rides worth mentioning in detail. The first was the Cat in the Hat ride to Monte Vista Elementary School. Members read to the kids in celebration of the birth of Dr. Seuss. During recess, they saw the bikes and asked us for autographs!

The second ride was the John & Jane Wayne Day with the 3rd Assault Amphibian Battalion (AABN) at Camp Pendleton. This was a day-long event designed to showcase the talents, dedication, and professionalism of the troops and give us a feel for their daily challenges. Chapter members rode in the trucks and participated in "a day in the life".

LOH held a "Queen of Hearts" ride and focused on their "Dinner and Spring Fashion Show" featuring the new Spring 2013 Men and Women's fashions from our Biggs H-D Motor Clothes Department: "from jewelry to helmets and everything in between." Anybody still have some 2013 H-D clothing?






I hope you enjoyed this stroll down Memory Lane. Maybe it will give you some ideas for a future ride or event that becomes "one for the books".
