Be Prepared

When I was young, I spent many years in the Boy Scouts. I was taught to always *Be Prepared*. When I was 12-13 years old *being prepared* had a different meaning all together than it does to me today. Back then, it meant having what would be needed for a campout and having knowledge of things such as first aid, how to use a compass,



how to tie various knots, etc. And how often did I tie those knots? How often did I use that compass or first aid kit? Not very often, but I had them with me and knew how to use them just in case. Now, if you want a story about teaching other young scouts what it meant to *Be Prepared*, find Ken C and ask him.

A few Saturdays ago, we rode down to El Cajon to join up with the El Patrón HOG Chapter and support their St Patrick's Day Poker Run. It was 45 degrees when I rolled out of my garage in Temecula at 6:45 AM. Layered up with a base layer, T-shirt, long sleeve flannel, leather vest and then a jacket, I turned up the heated grips and headed out. It was a chilly ride but I was comfortable with my gear. OC Pat remarked that there was sleet in Orange County when he left his house that morning. Once we got to El Cajon I took the jacket off and stored it in the tour pack The weather in San Diego that day was perfect riding weather, high 60s and sunny. When we got back to El Cajon for lunch, I took the flannel off. But when I took off to head back home, I put the flannel back on, mostly for sun protection. Leaving El Cajon, I ran out to San Diego Harley for a look at what they had. While there, my wife texted me asking about the weather. I told her it was a beautiful day and she told me it was raining back in Temecula. I got on the bike and headed north. As I was getting close to Escondido, I could see the dark clouds ahead and it looked very grey to the northeast. I decided to stop and get gas at the Shell station on El Norte where we meet up for long distance rides and I put my jacket back on. As soon as I got on the freeway the first rain drops hit my visor. Luckily for me, when we were at ROC in February, Taz mentioned Rain-X for plastic and how good it works. I had bought a bottle and sprayed it on my visor last week. And I can attest that it works great. I rode the rest of the way in the rain.

I rode 233 miles that day and loved every mile because I was *prepared* for whatever came my way. Now, I'm not going to tell you that I always do that, I have been caught out in the rain with just a T-shirt and a half helmet and those tiny rain drops feel like needles at 60 MPH. At least I wasn't riding in GoldWing gear (shorts, flip flops & a tank top). The point is, riding is a blast and it's even better when you are *prepared* for those unplanned things that can happen along the road.

Group Riding Habits

I'm sure everyone is aware that in our Chapter we change lanes from the back to the front; and we do not change lanes until the signal comes back from the Ride Leader. Often the Sweep will go out and capture a lane early, the thing to do is ignore him until you see the signal come back. Once it does, you should be checking your mirrors waiting your turn to



change lanes as the move has made its way to you from the back of the group. Before moving into the other lane, ALWAYS check that the lane is clear for YOU. Just because the other riders have made it, that doesn't mean someone in an adjacent lane isn't going to wedge their car into the open lane. They don't know what we are doing. Generally, our lane change method works well, but there have been occasions where a rider has seen traffic that looks like it might be an issue, so they've changed lanes as soon as the signal comes back. The problem is that rider is the third or fourth bike in a group of 15. All this does is confuse the rest of the group, who then switch lanes when they feel like it. This usually results in cars being cut off; and that, my friends, is dangerous.

Sometimes when we do our lane changes it's hard for the Ride Leader to tell if the Sweep has room to move over into the desired lane and capture it for the group. The signal will come on and in succession everyone in the group will signal. But nothing happens. We patiently wait and then our signal times out. The Leader signals again and so does the group. But nothing happens. That's because the Sweep can't move into that lane due to a vehicle keeping pace with the group and not allowing the Sweep to move over. What often happens is someone in the middle of the group will get tired of waiting and will just change lanes. Once people ahead of that person sees bikes changing lanes behind them, they follow the pattern and move over as well. This can separate the group and potentially trap cars in the group with riders still attempting to get into the lane with the rest of the group. Then, the driver of the car sees that they are surrounded by bikes and looks for the tiniest sliver of daylight to make their escape, thus putting riders at danger.

Here's another example: When stopped at a stop sign, the Ride Leader may signal a car that's coming from a cross street to go ahead, even if the group rolled up first. We do this to let traffic clear, which will help keep the group together as we leave the stop. Unfortunately, we've seen that some riders have noticed this and have tried to help out by making the same gesture to the car. The Ride Leader is trying to communicate with the driver of that car, and it can cause confusion if the driver sees multiple people gesturing. Plus, it can be dangerous. I have seen it where the Ride Leader had not gestured for the car to go, but another rider in the group did. The Ride Leader can't see it when that happens, and since it's his turn to go, he very easily could have rolled away from the stop – and right into the path of a car whose driver had been told to go ahead by someone else in the group. Luckily, the driver in this instance waived off the "go ahead" and gestured for our entire group to go. But it very easily could have gone the other way, and resulted in one, two, or even three bikes getting hit.

The Road Guards are taught that being the Ride Leader is like driving a big rig truck & trailer. The Ride Leader has to feel like the rear tire of the Sweep is his rear tire. And he has to lead the group with that mindset. When the Ride Leader, Mid-Pack, and Sweep are all on the same page and working together, it makes the ride go as smooth as possible. There will always be things that come up on any given ride but it is important to let those designated to serve the group that day do their job and the rest of us do ours by following the Chapter guidelines we learn at Formation 101.



Biggs H-D Rider Rewards

Greetings to all our Biggs H.O.G. family members! April showers bring May flowers (and the southern California weather we all know and love). I don't know about you, but I'm tired of seeing wet roads and umbrellas! So with that intro out of the way let's get into this month's membership portion of the HOG Express Newsletter.



Do you have a *Rider Rewards* account at Biggs H-D? If you don't know the answer to that question, you can contact me and I will make sure you are set up with a *Rider Rewards* number and provide you with that number so you can begin enjoying this awesome benefit.

Speaking of benefits, here is just one more benefit of being a Biggs HOG Chapter Member. Instead of the standard 1x points for every dollar you spend in the Biggs H-D Parts, Motor Clothes, and Service departments (labor not included), as a Biggs HOG Chapter Member, you earn 2x points for all your purchases and 3x points on the days of monthly Chapter meetings.

For every 500 *Rider Rewards* points you earn, you can redeem those *Rider Rewards* points for a \$25.00 certificate which you can use for any purchase at Biggs Harley-Davidson except for sale items.

To earn a \$25 certificate at the 1x multiplier level, you will need to spend \$500, which equates to a 5% discount. To earn the \$25 certificate at the 2x multiplier level, you will need to spend \$250, which equates to a 10% discount. And to earn the \$25 certificate at the 3x multiplier level, you will only need to spend \$167, which equates to a 15% discount. It pays to come to the Chapter meetings.

Please wait 72 hours after any purchases for your newly earned points to be available in your account to use towards a *Rider Rewards* certificate.

You can also earn *Rider Rewards* points in other ways throughout the year; some of these include buying a motorcycle from Biggs H-D or by being one of the first riders to sign-up for a Biggs Harley-Davidson Crew Ride on the morning of the scheduled ride.

And remember to visit the Biggs Service Department to log your mileage for *Ride 365*. It's advisable to do this at least twice a year. HOG suggests recording your mileage as soon as the new year begins and again toward the year's end to ensure no miles are lost. Keep in mind, only the Biggs H-D Service Department can officially log your miles to qualify for *Ride 365* program incentives. You must <u>EXPLICITLY</u> make a verbal request while visiting the Service Department to have your mileage recorded; the logging of your mileage is not part of any other service you are having performed at the dealership. If you're riding with a passenger, make sure to ask to have their mileage recorded as well.

Additionally, Non-Member Guests are always welcome to join us on our Chapter rides. All they need to do is sign the appropriate waiver paperwork prior to the ride.




